








Included are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ashfield Parade – Foreshore stabilisation and access. Application is in for funding • Ashfield Flats – Chapman Drain streamlining. Some money is in the TofB budget to progress this. • Private Landing: At Anstey Road and Daylesford Road. Old private landing will be removed and the area revegetated. <p>Ann is in the office at TofB Monday, Wednesday and Thursday.</p>

When asked what BPG has accomplished in the past 5 years she mentioned running the Photo Exposition with the Historical Society, and working with the TofB at Ashfield Flats. In response to what direction should be taken for the next five years, she suggested further progress with streamlining at Ashfield Flats.</p>

<p>8.16 Attempts to block river access: Under the Metropolitan Region Scheme the river foreshore is zoned for public access, although some is still privately held. RAG (River Action Group) is pushing for homeowners to resume land along the river adjacent to their property. In response to this, Martin Whitely raised a grievance in Parliament to put a path from Sandy Beach to Guildford Bridge. This isn't practical because the banks are too steep in some sections.</p>
